Where M.F. Husain's horses stood in the art race

The number of M.F. Husain works featuring horses that have been sold in auctions since 2000. Though Husain painted a wide range of subjects, the equine animal was a quintessential signature of his,

appearing in a range of dimensions, and on a variety of materials. These works have generated sales worth ₹222 crore. The first work featuring this subject to be auctioned was White Horse that achieved ₹1.1 lakh in a Sotheby's sale in 1992. Read in context to the highest price ever achieved by the subject—a record established in March earlier this year—wherein Christie's sold a spectacular large-format canvas measuring 50 x 81 inches for ₹7.12 crore, and you would note the market movement of this subject. According to a recently released

Artery India report, between 2014 and 2018, the artist's works sold in auction realized ₹327 crore, of which ₹76.3 crore was from the subject of horses. This is the single-highest tally for a subject for this artist, across all five years for which reviews were conducted since 2000. There were a total of 68 works, 57 of which were canvases, claiming the majority of the turnover at ₹71.6 crore. The highest achieved for a work, on paper, featuring this subject to be sold during this 5-year review is ₹26.34 lakh for a larger-than-the-norm ink and watercolour, measuring 50 x 27 inches that was sold by Saffonart in June 2018. This was just below the all-time high for this medium that stands at ₹28.95 lakh.
